Fall Career & Internship Mega Fair

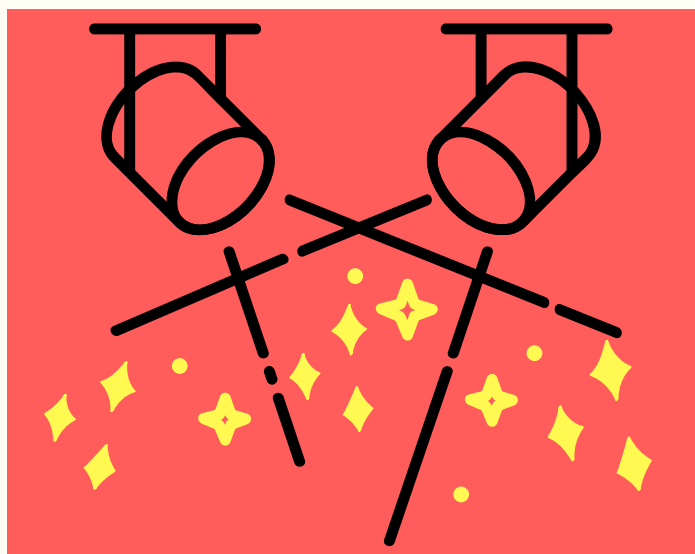
