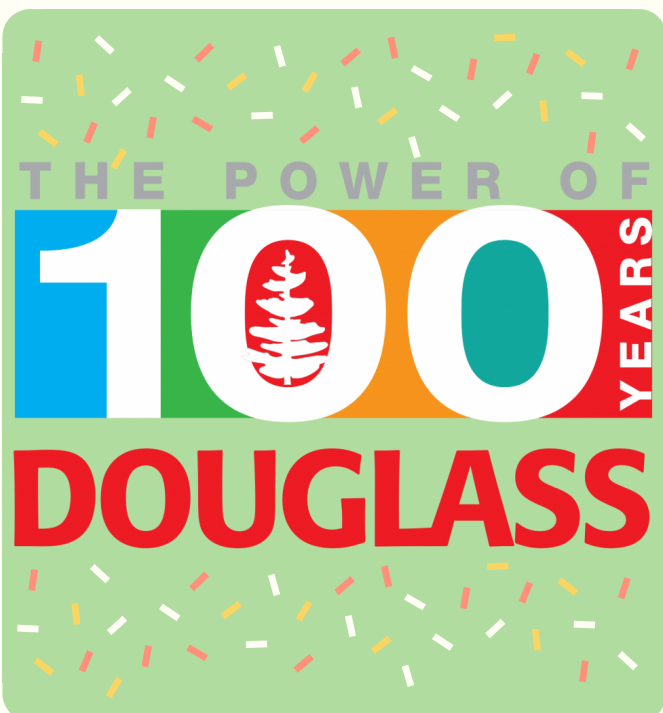

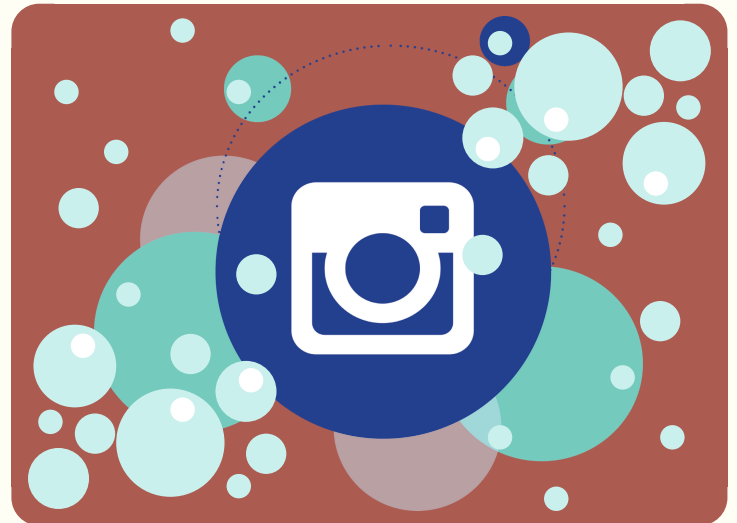


Writers at Rutgers Reading Series | Tyehimba Jess
